What a Foster Parent needs:

What do Foster Parents do:

- Help pets who need additional car setting
- They take animals into their own h exercise, food, grooming, and love medications, socialising, or traini
- Foster societies tend to provide all

Conditions

- Must be of legal age
- Any other animals in the household must be up to date on vaccinations and spayed/neutered
- Must have reliable transport
- Ideally a enclosed yard for foster dogs
- Commitment to the duration of the time the animal is in foster care (2w to 4m; vary depending on the animal and time of year)
- Signed waiver and release

Reasons to Foster:

- Fostering = More animals rescued
- Teach your foster pet what it's like to have a loved family it's fun @
- Human interaction helps foster animals who come from neglect/abusive situations
- Fostering increases the likelihood of adoption and reduces the chances of an animal being returned

- If you already have one or more animals, one more won't make a difference to you, but it will make a difference to the animal that otherwise may not have a second chance at life.
- Animal companionship without a lifetime commitment

What do Shelters look for in adopter's:

- Responsible ownership: Animal shelters want to ensure that their animals are going to homes where they will be well-cared for and treated with love and respect. Adopters who have a history of responsible pet ownership are usually preferred.
- Compatibility: Animal shelters want to make sure that the adopter's lifestyle and personality are a good match for the animal's temperament and energy level. For example, an active dog may not be a good fit for someone who lives in a small apartment with no yard.
- Financial stability: Adopting a pet can be a significant financial commitment, and shelters may look for adopters who have the financial stability to cover basic needs, including food, veterinary care, and grooming.
- Commitment: Adopting a pet is a lifelong commitment, and shelters want to ensure that adopters are prepared to provide a loving home for its life.
- Safe environment: Animal shelters want to ensure the ad safe environment for an animal. As part of the process for rescue can be used to insure that the animal is going to a safe

What do people think of the adoption process:

Positives:

- Saving an animal: Depending on the type of shelter, anim can sometimes be euthanized. Adoption can give an anim from a poor living situation a loving home and a second ch
- Building a special bond: rescue animals can sometimes hc owner unlike dogs that were bought from breeders.
- Cost effective: adopting an animal can be much cheaper th breed.
- A compassionate thing to do: some animals in shelters ca homes or the street, adopting it and giving it a loving and c considered a compassionate thing to do.

Negatives:

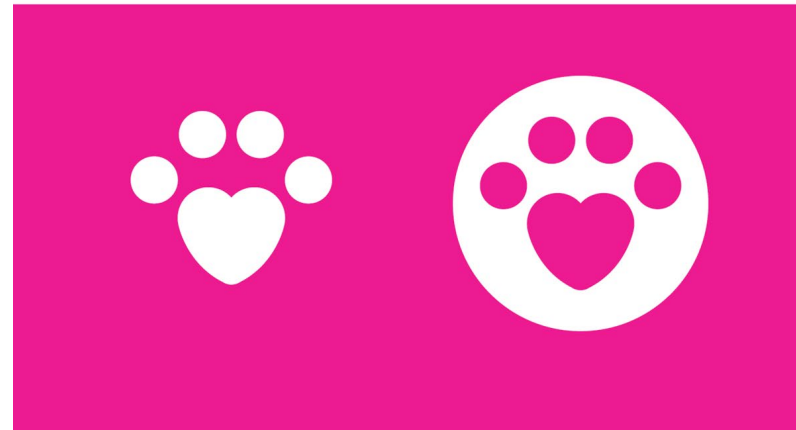
- Unreliable and competitive: some complain that during the process of adoption the animal that they applied to adopt may end up going to a different home.
- Medical issues and expenses: adopting an animal may also mean taking on the responsibility and cost for any medications or medical conditions the animal may have
- Behavioural issues: animals in shelters may have a range in levels of training and some may not be well behaved or properly trained to the standard a foster home may want. They might also not be compatible with already owned pets at home.
- Time commitment: the adoption process along with potential training or vet visits can be a very long process and take up alot of time.
- Costs: Although adopting can be cheaper than purchasing from a breeder it still has its associated expenses. Sometimes people feel these expenses to be unjustified considering the age, behaviour or medical issues that are associated with an animal.
- Limited selection: When adopting potential adopters may not find the specific breed they prefer.

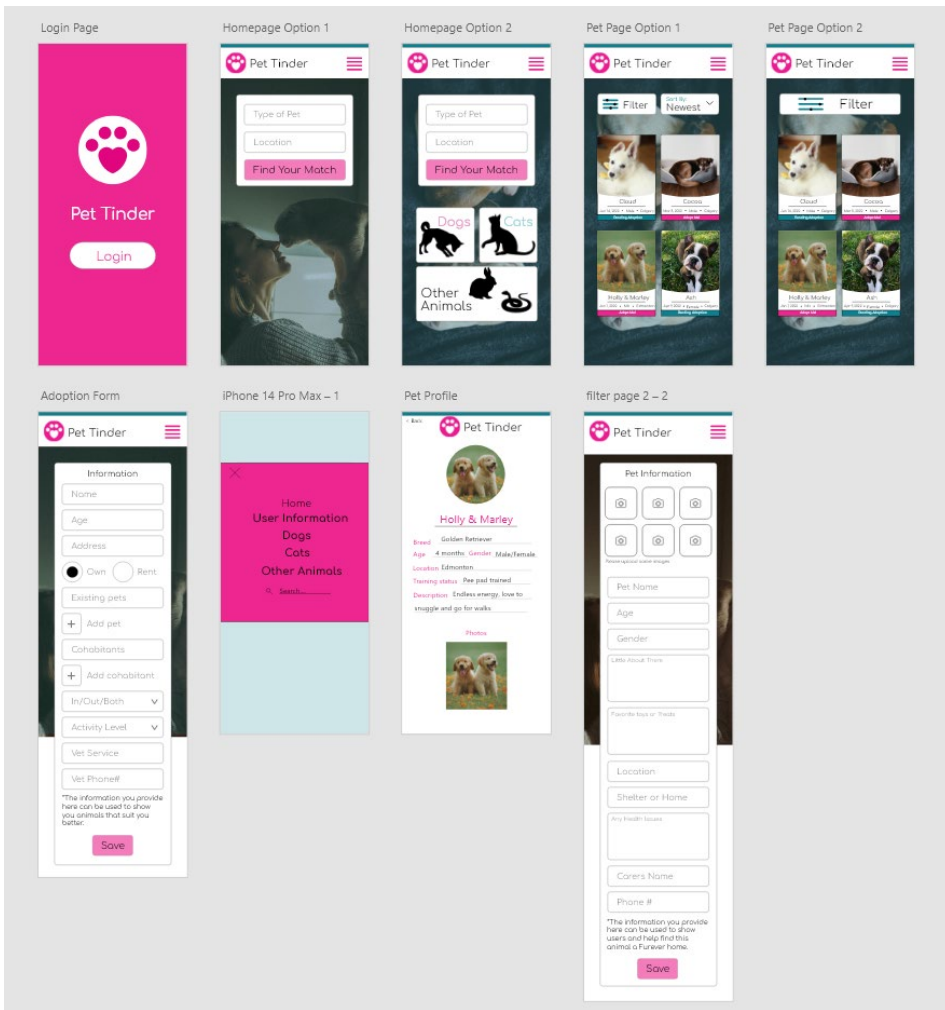

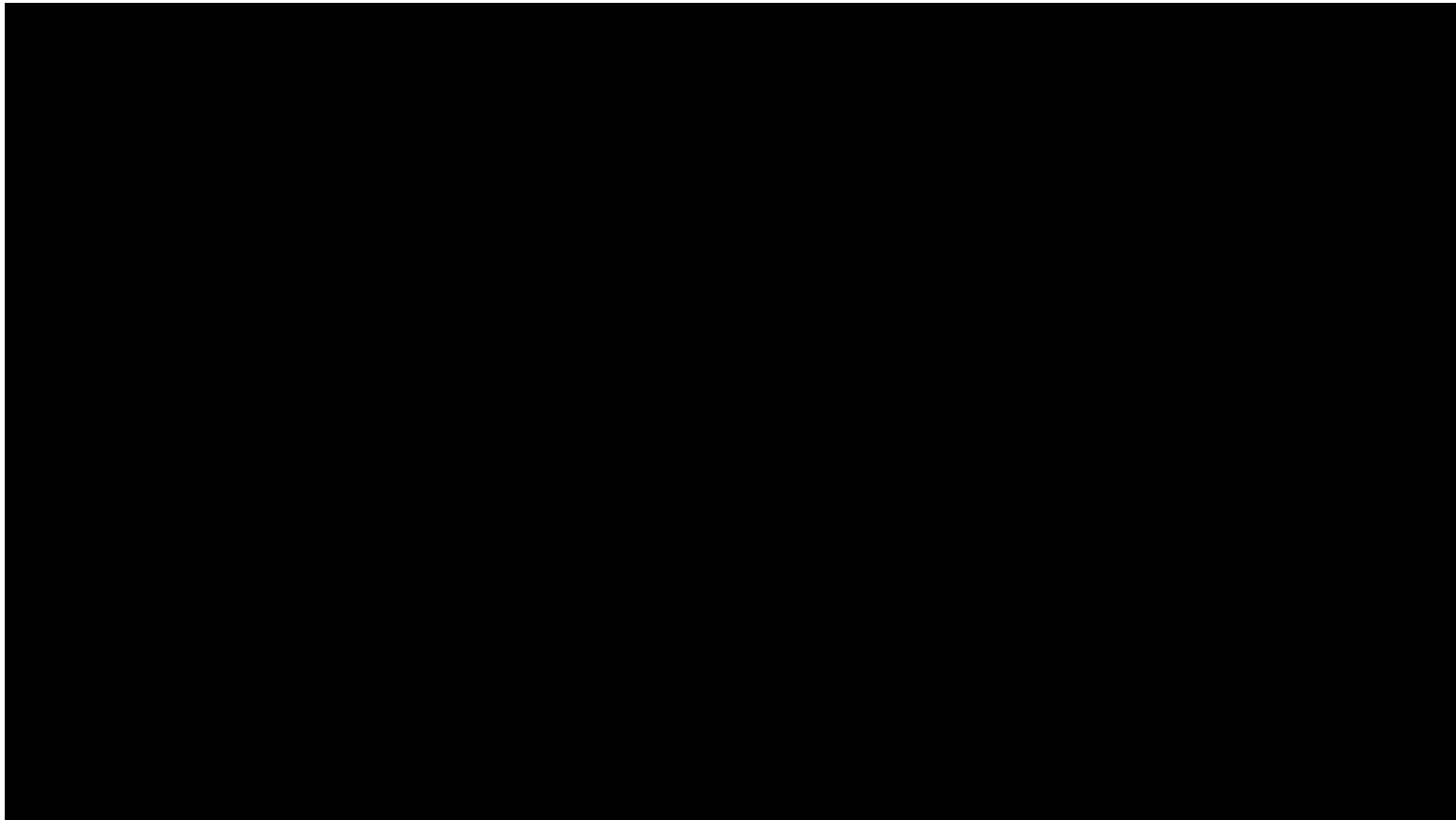
